

Stand Construction Checklist

The following stand structures/special constructions require approval:

- Exhibition stands with a floor area for more than 100 m² (outdoor area for more than 50 m²)
- Exhibition stands with a height of more than 3 m
- Two-storey stand structures (not possible in Hall B0) [Notice Two-storey Stand construction 1.3 Application for Special Stand Designs](#)
- LED walls measuring more than 6 m² (in compliance with DIN 56929)
- Exhibition stands with horizontal stand coverings

The following systems and equipment require notification, acceptance and/or approval: [1.2 Registration of preventive fire protection](#)

- Vehicles with combustion engines
- Vehicles with electric drives
- Vehicles powered by hydrogen
- Containers
- Functional battery storage
- Row and table seating for more than 200 people
- Projection or film screenings in darkened rooms
- Use of compressed gases, liquid gases, flammable liquids and deep fryers > 50l capacity (individually or in total)
- Handling welding equipment and working with naked flames
- Open fires and activities involving a fire hazard
- Pyrotechnics
- Acids and alkalis
- Use of radioactive materials and materials posing a biohazard
- Plant decorations made of treated moss (e.g. reindeer moss)
